OPPORTUNITIES OFFERED TO FILM MAKERS

Bradford boasts a long tradition of famous films, film locations, actors, producers, directors, and of course the National Media Museum. Bradford's history is also steeped in industrial entrepreneurial spirit, and **David Thompson**, writer, film maker and actor is on a mission to nurture both of these things that Bradford is so very proud of. David, who aims to inspire people with a passion for cinema, and a desire to make feature length films, to break in to the industry, says, "in the British system film makers usually make three or four government funded short films, do a TV series for a few years and then get their chance with a feature film, probably making a lot of mistakes with a lot of money in front of big audiences." With the recession set to continue and government cuts to arts and culture, Thompson sees this as the perfect time for the independent film industry in Britain to take off and thinks Saltaire is the perfect place to do it.

David says, "I am on a mission to support entrepreneurial creativity in Yorkshire, I've put together a course for people who would love to make a feature length film but don't have the skills, confidence or big budget. The 2-day course will teach how to write, shoot and direct no-budget feature films and inspire people to go out and do it". Yorkshire certainly has the talent, locations and resources to make it big in the film industry and IndyFilm might just be the way forward. There is a gulf between the amateur creativity and the polished big budget or Working Title Films, and IndyFilm aims to bridge that gap by inspiring small personal stories, that are big on creativity and originality.

HOST HOMES SOUGHT BY GLOBAL XCHANGE

If you haven't already heard, City of Bradford YMCA is now the official Bradford partner of Global Xchange and we are now embarking on our first international cultural exchange project. Global Xchange is a partnership between VSO, The British Council and other partner organisations around the world. Working directly with the UK Department for International Development (DFID), Global Xchange is part of the pilot year of International Citizen Service (ICS). In the autumn we will begin our 6-month programme between Bradford and the Bohol Province, Philippines. Ten volunteers from the UK and ten from the Philippines, all aged between 18 and 22, will spend the 3 months in Bohol then 3 months in Bradford, living, working and learning in these communities. The volunteers will live with host families in Bradford from January to March 2012 (12 weeks), and the City of Bradford YMCA is now looking for expressions of interest from people willing to be hosts. A UK volunteer and a Filipino volunteer will be placed together. There will be two Programme Supervisors living and working in your community who are responsible for members of the team throughout the exchange and are available to provide support to host homes.

ICONS AND OTHER ART

Each year Saltaire Methodist Church organises an Arts event to co-ordinate with the Saltaire Festival. In the Church area of the building there is always an exhibition by a professional artist on a special theme. This year the artist Pamela Briggs will be showing her paintings of icons and modern paintings on the theme of "Heaven and Earth" which it is hoped will encourage contemplation and embrace the joy of colour, pattern movement and stillness. Pamela uses methods and materials which have been employed for over 2000 years (as a film will show). She was professionally trained at Barnsley Art School and Maidstone College and ultimately became head of Art at Barnsley sixth form College. She has been commissioned by the Friends of Mount Athos - Vatopidi Monastery, whose patron is HRH Prince Charles, to provide an icon for them.

On the ground floor there will be a display of paintings by the Saltaire Art Group and a feature will be a huge collage of about 7ft x 12ft entitled Carnival in Roberts Park.

Home-made refreshments will be available. Opening times are Saturdays, September 10th and 17th (10am - 4.30pm) and Sundays, 11th and 18th (noon - 4.30pm). **Jean Hinchcliffe**
